The ENOTTA Health Economics and Outcomes Research (HEOR) Training School is designed to equip participants with essential skills in health economics and the interpretation of pharmacoeconomic data.

Applications will be open from 25th October to 10th November 2023.

The ENOTTA HEOR Training School is directed towards young researchers, graduate students, early-career professionals, and senior professionals from various academic backgrounds who are eager to enhance their research skills and contribute to the field of health economics.

- A CV and a motivational letter should be submitted along with the application form. Use the motivational letter to describe how attending the training school will help advance your research.
- Applications are open for ENOTTA WG members only. You can become an ENOTTA member by applying in e-COST.
- Priority will be given to applicants with no HEOR advanced experience.
- Applicants will be accepted provided they are able to receive a visa in time for attending the training school.
- The selection process will account for the motivation letter and CV. We encourage the candidates to submit an abstract to the adjacent ENOTTA Work Group meetings taking place from 13th - 15th December (information on abstract submission below).

- **Foundations of Health Economics:** Gain a solid understanding of fundamental health economics concepts and principles.
- **Data Sources and Analysis:** Explore relevant data sources and databases for health economic research and practice data analysis techniques.
- **Study Design and Methodology:** Master the art of designing studies with a focus on economic evaluation.
- **Economic Analysis:** Delve into cost-effectiveness, cost- minimization and budget impact analysis methods and their applications.
- **Policy Implications:** Understand how health economic research informs healthcare policy decisions.
- **Interactive Learning:** Engage in practical exercises, case studies, and discussions led by experienced health economics experts.

An analytical programme, accompanied by the relevant material will be sent to participants ahead of arrival.

All presented abstracts will be published in the journal Proceedings of Research and Practice in Allied and Environmental Health

Abstract Requirements:

TITLE HERE (Arial 14 pt Bold, single spaced; two lines maximum, aligned left)

First and Last Name of 1st Author 1, First and Last Name of 2nd Author 2, ... (Arial 10pt, aligned left)

1 Institution, Address, Town, Country, e-mail (Arial 9 pt, italic, aligned left)

2 Institution, Address, Town, Country, e-mail (Arial 9 pt, italic, aligned left)

The abstract must be clear, concise, and written in Portuguese or English (Arial 10 pt, single-spaced).

Maximum: 300 words (title, authors, and institutions, and 3-5 keywords not included).

Authors should use the following style of structured abstracts, with headings:

Background: description of the theoretical framework. Objective: description of the aims of the study.

Methods: briefly describe the main methods or treatments applied/procedures used. Results: summarize the main results obtained, referring, when possible, to the numerical data found, with the due measurement units, and significance. Conclusions: indicate the main conclusions or interpretations of the work.

(Note: Abbreviations / Acronyms should be spelt out in full when first mentioned, followed by the abbreviation or acronym in brackets).

Keywords: keyword 1; keyword 2; keyword 3 (List three to five keywords)

Acknowledgements

Funding: Please add: "This research received no external funding" or "This research was funded by Name of funder, grant number XXX".

References

References should be numbered in order of appearance and using Arabic numeral between square brackets (e.g., [1] [2,3], or [4–6]). Use the following format:

Citation of a scientific article:

Author 1, A.B.; Author 2, C.D. Title of the article. Abbreviated Journal Name Year, Volume, page range.

Book citation:

Author 1, A.; Author 2, B. Book Title, 3rd ed.; Publisher: Publisher Location, Country, 2008; pp. 154–196.

Citation of a Book chapter:

Author 1, A.; Author 2, B. Title of the chapter. In Book Title, 2nd ed.; Editor 1, A., Editor 2, B., Eds.; Publisher: Publisher Location, Country, 2007; Volume 3, pp. 154-196.
